Alton's First Eco-Fair (deferred from last year), is a joint ATC/ ACAN venture

#### There will be lots to see, lots to hear, lots to do:

*Art.* The marquee (from the Last Night of the Proms the night before) will have an exhibition of children's art, sculptures made from waste materials and other displays.

**Talks**: The bandstand will be used for a series of speakers including students from Eggars and Amery Hill and the acclaimed author, Lucy Jones.

*Music*: During a 2 hour slot from mid-day we will have 2 bands playing, as well as The SOS from the Kids choir of Britain's Got Talent fame, and Frankie Morland who has had several television appearances with his song 'World in Danger'.

**Stalls**: Over twenty stalls have booked - there will be a Reuse, Repair, Recycle section under the awning and 5 Environmental charities coming along. ACAN, WalkAlton, CycleAlton will be there, and ALFI is sharing a stall with Alton & Villages Local Acton for Nature (AVLAN).

**Children's Activities**: There will be a trail for children to follow and children's art on display in the marquee.

*Food*: A coffee and cake booth, and a Vegan burger stall will provide refreshments and there is room for picnicking on the grass.

As the posters say, the Eco-Fair is 'Celebrating Earth-Friendly Living'. Come and join in.

We will, of course, be observing all Covid guidelines and practising social distancing.

# Cycle Alton

As many of you know from your involvement, or from our meetings and newsletters, groups of us have been working since last autumn on an analysis of the routes contained within the East Hampshire District Council's Local Cycling & Walking Infrastructure Plan (LCWIP).

The Alton Placemaking Strategy Group kindly invited us to present our findings to their meeting in May. The group is comprised of Councillors from all three local authorities, Damian Hinds MP and Officers. They discuss the 'placemaking' projects in Alton - the Alton Station Forecourt Regeneration and the Coors Brewery Development by CALA Homes, amongst other things.

Alton Community Share, recently relaunched its bi-monthly sessions at the St Lawrence Parish Centre and is looking for volunteers to help out for one Saturday a month.

Alton Community Share provides a valuable resource to help meet social responsibilities across the broad spectrum of the Alton Community. We provide a library of free to borrow things such as toys, books, jigsaws, games and craft resources to help with for instance improved mental health, care of the elderly, and supporting those affected by the post Covid world and at the same time positively impacting the community's need for better environmental impact. What better way is there than sharing the use of things

in our community and reduce waste at the same time?

Volunteering for Alton Community Share involves being at the Parish Centre to help set up for a 10.00am start, helping throughout the opening hours of 10.00am to 12 noon, welcoming visitors, then helping pack away. You will be working alongside a team of usually three others and will not be lone working. Volunteers can choose to help out on either the 2nd or 4th Saturday of the month.

Strict hygiene and control of infection rules are always followed. Volunteers are provided with masks and gloves. Items donated are quarantined to ensure there is no possibility of transmitting Covid-19 from them.

The "Plastic Free Alton" initiative was successfully launched at the Alton Community Fair with a litter pick and example non-plastic swaps for items that are frequently single-use plastic.

We spoke to several councillors who are very supportive and we've been invited to do an online presentation for them prior to putting forward a motion at the next Full Council meeting to formalise their involvement.



We have made contact with several businesses and organisations already and will be following up with them regarding the objectives of the scheme for becoming plastic-free champions.

Councillor Ginny Boxall is supporting our campaign to reduce the amount of single use plastic we use here in Alton.
