Young ACAN are eager to get started with a social survey to find out how much young people know about the environmental crisis and what they want to do about it.

Young ACAN's first public event is about sustainable fashion. On Saturday 2nd April they will be running a clothes swap (Thrift Shop) and upcycling workshops in the main hall at the Alton Maltings.

Lobbying & Campaigning group



Since our last update we have joined forces with HPF (Hampshire Pension Fund) Divest an offshoot of WinACC (Winchester Action on Climate Change) thus increasing our impact while at the same time sharing the load - definitely a win, win! Both groups work loosely with Dirty Money.

We are also analysing EHDC's Interim Planning Policy document as part of the public consultation due to end in early February. The aim of the document is to make it possible for EHDC to insist on higher building standards than the current minimum, in order to not have to retrofit homes built today in order to make then carbon neutral in a few years time.

And, of course, we continue to monitor and lobby our local councils and our MP on a variety of other issues.
