Hampshire County Council

Has launched its consultation on the Local Transport Plan 4 (LTP4).

https://www.hants.gov.uk/transport/localtransportplan/haveyoursay It is open to all Hampshire residents and will run to 26th June 2022.

ACAN and Cycle Alton will each be responding as local organisations, but please do make time to read at least the <u>Summary</u> of the plans and section 7.5 of the <u>Full report</u> which focuses on Rural Transport (pp 99 - 103) and fill in the questionnaire as an individual.

Those of you who attended our recent public meeting on transport will already be aware that a lot of good ideas are included in LTP4 but that the focus is very much on areas of higher population density. I am delighted to see climate and the environment listed as the top 2 outcomes on p14 of the summary.

However, on reading the summary, I noticed the words "Encourage" and "Support" were used a total of 59 times compared to 43 times for "Deliver" and "Implement" and that ratio got worse in section 7.5 of the Full document. Let us hope this doesn't turn out to be a lot of well meaning hot air followed by very little action.

Let it grow for No Mow May

Some parts of the districts green spaces will be left to grow this month as part of a national campaign aimed at supporting wildlife. East Hampshire District Council is taking part in 'No Mow May' to help the bees and support local biodiversity. Where possible, this season EHDC and Norse South East will alter some of their maintenance mowing schedules which are normally scheduled for during May to help promote wildflowers and encourage pollinators in less recreationally used areas.



These areas will be cut later in the year when flower heads have gone to seed, helping to encourage wildflowers, insects and wildlife.

The sites in Alton that will be left to grow wild during May are:

- Cherry Way (between Southview Rise, Maple Close, Lime Ave and Maple Close)
- Shipley Close
- Chauntsingers Road
- Goodwood Close
- The Ridgeway/Fontwell Drive
- Sailsbury Close
