What a couple of weeks it has been!

The government's updated plans for reaching net zero were announced last week and seem to involve very little new money with an emphasis on nuclear energy generation and carbon capture.

Both of these are very long term in their delivery and therefore not going to allow us to meet the demands of the <u>UN Secretary General that we bring forward our deadline</u> for net zero to 2040 to avoid irreversible climate change.

(see the latest UN IPCC Synthesis Report of a couple of weeks ago).

We really need to push our governments (both national and local) to do (as Antonio Guterres says) "*Everything, Everywhere, All the time*" that will:

- 1. Reduce greenhouse gas emissions
- 2. Increase the amount of carbon stored in the natural environment
 - 3. Restore our natural world to good health
- 4. Help our local community to adapt to more extreme weather events

So how do we help make this happen?

With elections coming up next month we can all take the opportunity to ask our local council candidates how they intend to address the climate and environmental crises we face.

We can email our MP to remind him how important and urgent the crisis is and point out that we need to adopt the recommendations of the Chris Skidmore review of a couple of months ago. Not least because the faster we get on with this the better our chances of becoming world leaders in green technology and reaping the financial rewards of being ahead of the competition.

We can stand up and be counted in Westminster on the weekend of 21 to 24 April at "The Big One". more details below.

On the plus side

Despite our own government dragging its feet there is significant progress being made around the globe. President Biden's Inflation Reduction Act has triggered a green race with Europe and China as companies vie to become leaders in green technologies.

Closer to home the Welsh government is to be applauded for massive cuts to their road infrastructure plans in favour of active travel and public transport.

ATC & EHDC council elections

Both ACAN's Lobbying & Campaigning group and Cycle Alton have come up with some questions to put to all candidates in these local elections, responses received will be made public in social media and the local paper.

ACAN's questions are:

In light of the publication of the latest UN IPCC report and the UN Secretary General's statement that the

developed countries need to bring forward their targets for net zero from 2050 to 2040 if we are to stand any chance of limiting global warming to 1.5C, we in ACAN would like to ask you the following questions:

If elected:

- 1. How will you make the climate and biodiversity crisis take the highest priority in all council decisions?
- 2. What specific areas do you believe require urgent action and how will you tackle these? How will you involve communities, voluntary groups, businesses, public sector partners, and other stakeholders in achieving joint area-wide climate and biodiversity targets?
- 3. How will you prioritise the publishing of environmental strategies and plans for the whole council area and how will you report on progress against these goals?
- 4. What actions would you champion to achieve real reductions in fossil fuels burned, not just by the council but also by the community as a whole?

Cycle Alton's questions are:

If elected:

- 1. Will you commit to supporting the development and delivery of an active travel network of safe, accessible and direct routes, including cycling infrastructure networks designed to national standards, in our town and rural routes to link them?
- 2. Will you commit to making 20-minute neighbourhoods a central principle in local planning, transport, health and economic policies?
- 3. Will you commit to ensuring policy and investment in walking, cycling and public transport prioritises people who are disadvantaged or marginalised?
- 4. Have you challenged Damian Hinds MP about the cut to active travel funding, and asked him to request that Transport Secretary Mark Harper reverses the cuts?
- 5. Will you challenge Damian Hinds MP about the government announcement to spend four times the Active Travel budget on EV charging?

The Big One - 100,000 coming to Westminster



Friday April 21 - UNITE TO SURVIVE

Community groups and supporting organisations from around the world begin People's Pickets at multiple Government Department buildings.

Saturday April 22 - EARTH DAY

An enormous, celebration & family-friendly march for biodiversity! Costumes, music, giant puppets for the annual international day of environmental awareness.

Sunday April 23 - RUNNING OUT OF TIME

Engaging activities continue. Impactful outreach runs alongside the London Marathon with their blessing.

Monday April 24 - CHOOSE YOUR FUTURE

People's Pickets return with renewed pressure.
Time for lasting connections and planning next steps.

At the last count <u>over 90 organisations</u> had signed up in support of The Big One organised by Extinction Rebellion, from Friends of the Earth, Greenpeace, and Tearfund down to small local groups like ACAN. The aim is to get 100,000 in Westminster to protest the government's dismal record on climate and environmental action.

We appreciate that many people are concerned about Extinction Rebellion as a result of their history of disruptive actions, but they have made it absolutely clear to their supporters, and are working closely with the Metropolitan Police, to ensure this is a safe, non-disruptive, family-friendly series of events.
