Lots of people consider "Retail therapy" to be just a bit of fun, but the expression was first coined in 1986 by a Chicago journalist reflecting on the Christmas shopping frenzy :

"We've become a nation measuring out our lives in shopping bags and nursing our psychic ills through retail therapy."

There are so many better way to address our psychic ills!

And don't get me started on the throw away economy as evidenced at festivals. Apparently 2,000 tons of waste is left behind at Glastonbury every year - a lot of it "disposable" tents and sleeping bags.

This can't go on.

Let's see festival organisers include the hire of a tent and sleeping bag in the ticket price with a deposit repayable on departure if the items are returned in good condition.



We can choose to minimise our environmental impact.

Why hang on to stuff we are never going to use again, often things that could be re-used if we donated them to Alton Community Share, Resurrection Furniture or one of Alton's many charity shops.

Which brings me back to the story of my stepfather who, when downsizing from the old family home, decided to buy 2 neighbouring bungalows - one to live in and one to store all the stuff he had accumulated over the years and could not bear to part with!

I am hugely relieved to report that common sense did eventually prevail, he was allowed to withdraw from the purchase of the second bungalow and we were able to order a skip instead.

12,795 possessions!

She is by no means unique. We could probably all learn a lot from taking such an in depth look at our own accumulated stuff!

At the East Hampshire District Council meeting last Thursday a motion was approved to bring forward their target date for becoming Carbon neutral from 2050 to 2035.



The first step will be to conclude the audit of the council's carbon footprint, looking at what can be cut or changed and finding ways to speed up decarbonisation within the council.

June 2023 was the hottest on record in the UK. The year 2023 is set to be the hottest on record globally. Heatwaves are increasing in frequency and severity. Whilst some welcome the heat, it can be uncomfortable or even dangerous for others, such as the elderly or those in poor health. Hot weather puts a strain on our infrastructure, health services and green spaces, including the risk of wildfires and melting tarmac.

ACAN is delighted to welcome a team of speakers from the Petersfield Society, PeCAN (ACAN's sister organisation Petersfield Climate Action Network) and Hampshire County Council who are experts in public health and the built and natural environment.

Local business people came together to discuss saving money by being more environmentally friendly at Goldfinch Bookshop in Alton last month.

The Rural Business Network (part of EHDC), Energy Alton and ACAN (Alton Climate Action Network) were on hand to answer questions about access to loans and grants, waste management, and how to collect and use energy data to lower both costs and emissions.

Pennie Brown, the Strategy Manager for Sustainable Growth at EHDC, said:

"We are currently refreshing the council's [climate and environment strategy](#), and the conversation with the businesses was invaluable to find out how we can best help.

Stuart Mills, from [Energy Alton](#), said:

"From the free energy surveys that our volunteers provided to 30 local businesses, we found that business owners really appreciated being given a tailored list of energy efficiency improvement options."

Eleanor Hill, from [ACAN](#), added:

"The journey to a business becoming fully sustainable can take the form of many small steps – such as encouraging members of staff to break daily habits and try something new – to larger projects such as undertaking a waste energy audit, or actively encouraging different modes of transport to get to work."

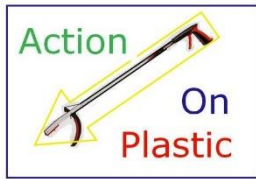
