#### Farnborough Airport Expansion Planning Application

As you probably know Farnborough Airport wants to:

annual aircraft movements for non-weekdays,

a) increase the maximum number of annual aircraft movements from 50,000 to 70,000 per annum, including an increase in non-weekday aircraft movements from 8,900 to 18,900 per annum, b) amend the aircraft weight category of 50,000 - 80,000 Kg, to 55,000 - 80,000 Kg, and an increase from 1,500 to 2,100 annual aircraft movements within this category, including an increase from 270 to 570


# ACAN talking about the benefits of plant-based foods
