We are sorry to report the future of our much loved Community Cupboard is under threat.


As they can only stay at *Little Vintage Interiors at the top of Market Street* until the end of June.

Green skills courses

Colleges across Hampshire and Surrey have joined together to help tackle the climate crisis by creating two 'Carbon Literacy' courses to give an introduction into what the climate change issue is and how we can all make changes to reduce our carbon footprint.

The courses are FREE and available now, accessed via the Innovation South Virtual Campus (ISVC) here https://em3.isvc.co.uk/;

On the ISVC website you will also see courses for local businesses who wish to develop a more sustainable business model, topics include:

- Introduction to Domestic Retrofitting
- Introduction to Retrofit Technologies
- Introduction to Sustainable Resource Management
- Rainwater and Greywater Harvesting
- Tree Planting and Climate Change

Local colleges are also providing free training opportunities for businesses in working with electric and hybrid vehicles and renewable energy technologies such as heat pumps and solar.
