# Listen to the Children is a touring exhibition by Alton Climate Action Network on display in the Allen Gallery cafe from 16 - 29 May 2023.

In June 2022, Alton Climate Action Network (ACAN) conducted a survey among 7–11-year-old primary school pupils in Alton. They wanted to discover the extent of their knowledge and fears around the climate crisis:

The exhibition "Listen to the Children" features 29 out of the 115 answers - these are the concerns of our children, and we should all ask ourselves whether we are doing enough to prevent all these fears from becoming reality for our children and grandchildren.

This exhibition gives the children a voice and hopes to inspire adults to become active allies for positive change. It is aimed at anyone with an interest in the climate crisis; parents; teachers; mental health professionals etc.

Please note: The exhibition is not designed for children, it is intended to offer a new perspective for adults on the issues that concern younger generations around climate change.

**Monday 29 May, 11am:** Closing Event with speeches talking about the data behind the exhibition by project manager Scott, reading of a speech originally delivered by Young ACAN activist Lillie Ewans, who wrote one of the introductions for the accompanying booklet, and the opportunity for discussion.





# **Help Count the Species at Flood Meadows**

Alton Town Council is organising a Bioblitz to identify as many species as possible in a specific area of the Flood Meadows on *Thursday 1st June from 10am - 3pm*.

At a Bio-Blitz, scientists, families, students, teachers, and other community members work together to get a snapshot of an area's biodiversity. This will be used as a base-line to measure any changes (hopefully improvements) over time.


The talk will be followed by a discussion of how we can get involved in this plan locally.
