### **Call to Action**

WinACC (Winchester Action on Climate Change) are spearheading a campaign to stop Hampshire County Council (HCC) issuing or renewing any more licences for oil and gas extraction.



We in ACAN recently discovered that the licence for oil extraction from a site in Avington, has been renewed by HCC, effective until December 2026.

We have written to Councillor Andrew Joy our HCC Councillor for Alton and our MP Damian Hinds, as well as writing to The Herald to publicise this insanity and demand that it stops.

We have pointed out that our own Eco-Streets survey results show that 97% of respondents are concerned about the climate crisis and most of them feel radical changes are needed to address it. Our local and national government must acknowledge this concern and recognise they have a mandate to act decisively and urgently to stop burning fossil fuels and build a future in which our young people can thrive.

# East Hants Greenhouse Gas (GHG) Emissions Report

Last month we reported the exciting news that EHDC has brought forward their net zero target to 2035 - more details here.

Now we must offer grateful thanks to Peter Moss of PeCAN, working with WinACC, who has produced the first detailed report of where GHGs come from in the East Hampshire District. This will make it much easier for EHDC to assess and measure their progress on that journey.

The major finding is that 83% of East Hampshire's territorial emissions come from transport (almost entirely road transport), domestic energy consumption (mainly heating) and agriculture (mainly livestock). The path to territorial net zero will require a focus on these three activities.

We need to achieve net zero by 2035 to keep global warming as close as possible to 1.5 - 2.0 degrees, above which the impacts on human beings and on nature will be increasingly catastrophic. ACAN and PeCAN will be working with East Hants District Council and lobbying government to take urgent action on

### **Some Good News**

In a groundbreaking legal decision, a judge in Montana ruled in favour of the young people who had accused state officials of violating their constitutional rights by promoting fossil fuels. The judge agreed that a stable climate is included in a right to a "clean and healthful environment", as guaranteed in the state's constitution.



This happened at the same time as a growing number of countries are considering adding the crime of Ecocide to their statute books. Is the tide finally turning?

# Eco-Streets Phase 2 starting in Hop Field Place & Ackender Hill

This project will build on the experiences and insights gained during the first Eco-Streets project and will focus on nature and creativity through poetry or songwriting workshops, painting and theatre as well as wildlife gardening and litter picking. The original Eco-Streets project showed that the lack of action is due to a lack of emotional involvement, rather than knowledge. We will try to address this lack by delivering several outreach events at the two estates, including outdoor evening talks on bats, hedgehogs and foxes, a neighbourhood picnic, and litter picks. We also plan to assist residents to buy and instal swift boxes and to create more wildlife verges like the successful verge we planted in Bolle Road with the original Eco-Streets project.

Besides assisting residents to do their bit for the wildlife around them and inspiring them to take steps towards a more sustainable lifestyle, we also aim to promote ACAN's many offers to people who may not yet be aware of ACAN's many groups and opportunities to get active for the climate.
