Restore Nature Now - London march

ACAN was proud to be among the 350 supporting organisations of the Restore Nature Now event hosted by naturalists Chris Packham and Megan McCubbin in London, on 22nd June 2024.

A dozen of us went along and were swept up in the theatre of the event with wonderful placards, costumes, music and chanting and were able to enjoy the company of thousands of likeminded people all determined to bring the environmental crisis to the attention of all our parliamentary candidates.

The speeches were inspiring and echoed the need for more urgent work to be done to increase our woefully depleted biodiversity (1 in 6 species in this country are under threat of extinction). Many speakers reminded us that the UK is one of the 10 most nature depleted countries in the world. On the plus side we were also told about many projects that are already addressing the problem and the many ways we can do our bit to help.

<u>Chris Packham spoke</u> about the need for action and made the point that despite the amount of sewage flowing into our rivers, it is agriculture that is the number one source of river pollution and is responsible for 35% of our greenhouse gas emissions. What we so badly need is a complete rethink of how we grow food and fund farming, for the benefit of ourselves, our farmers and our natural world.

<u>Dale Vince</u> (founder of Ecotricity and owner of Forest Green Rovers – so far the only vegan football club, but soon maybe just the first) made it very clear that the most important thing we can all do is cut our meat and dairy consumption so that all the land we currently use to grow feed for animals, can be repurposed to grow crops directly for human consumption or rewilded for nature. Rebecca Speight of the RSPB reminded us that nature is our best ally in addressing the climate crisis and Taylor Swift was urged to give up her private jet!

Not surprisingly there was a big focus on the sewage being dumped in our rivers with the most memorable and heartfelt chant heard along the march being "Less faeces, more species!"

BIODIVERSITY INCREASES ON PERTUIS AVENUE

AVLAN volunteers conducted an annual Orchid count in late June on Pertuis Avenue, with more recorded than previous years. Both the left and right-hand side of the road near the entrance to Ackender Woods have been designated as RVEI (Road Verges of Ecological Importance), which means the council follows a different mowing regime (only twice a year). This is allowing more growth of key species compared to cutting the verge more regularly.

The biodiversity of plants and specifically the number of orchids has improved with this amended mowing regime. The initial count of common spotted orchids in 2022 was 120, but this year over 260 were counted. In addition, AVLAN counted 3 different species of orchid (Common spotted, Pyramidal and Bee). What is also good news is that we are now seeing lots of other wildflowers and in turn more bees, butterflies and other insects. Consequently AVLAN are now considering a separate survey of all the flowers.

It is not advised that people walk along the verge to have a look – there is no footpath and it is busy with traffic - but it is good to know that orchids and biodiversity are thriving.

Victory in the Supreme Court about the Horse Hill oil field expansion in Surrey.

On 20th June 2024 the <u>Supreme Court ruled</u> that the emissions from burning the oil extracted from the expansion of the Horse Hill oil field in Surrey should have been included in the environmental impact assessment produced for Surrey County Council, before they considered the planning application for the expansion of the field.

Up to now only the emissions from the building of the well and its infrastructure were considered. The case was brought by the Weald Action Group and is seen as a landmark ruling which could not just see future applications rejected, but some recent ones, such as Rosebank, losing their planning permission as well.
