Chris Packham gave this tip for us all on Earth Day

"Move your money out of fossil fuel backing banks."

This is one of the easiest and most effective ways to reduce our impact on the planet and sends a powerful message to our most short-sighted banking institutions.

The bank that repeatedly comes top in ethical bank rankings is Triodos Bank, originating from the Netherlands with its UK base in Bristol. It promises to only finance organisations and projects making a positive impact for people and the planet.

Another regularly near the top of the list is Nationwide and they do have a branch in Alton.


The Future of ACAN

Since lockdown many people have expressed concerns about the huge rise in online ordering and all the extra emissions from the courier miles driven to deliver these items, especially the last mile from distribution centre to doorstep.

Zedify is a company tackling this problem in cities, using their <u>parcel consolidation system</u> to transfer our items to electric cargo bikes for that "last mile".

It will be a long time before anything like this comes to Alton but it is good to know that city air is getting cleaner all the time with initiatives like these.

Look out for their distinctive livery in Brighton, Bristol, Cambridge, Edinburgh, Glasgow, London, Manchester, Norwich & Plymouth.



The repair team will be at your service to assist and advise you on repairs to small household items and textiles.




