

Highlights of our Second Year

Extraordinary progress in an extraordinary year

2020

Jan - March

- ACAN website <u>altonclimatenetwork.org.uk</u> launched.
- ACAN's Community Hub at Alton Community Centre planned for launch at Easter and substantial funds raised *postponed to 2021 due to Covid-19 pandemic*.
- Promotional ACAN Banner placed in The Alton Herald.
- Alton Eco-Fair in Public Gardens planned with Town Council for July postponed to 2021 due to Covid-19 pandemic.

May

- ACAN registered with the Charity Commission as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO)
- **Cycle Alton** launched to give Alton's cycling groups and individuals a campaigning voice for safer cycling and better cycling infrastructure

June

• **Community Share** launched with donations "by the community for the community" to save money, reduce waste and re-use preloved stuff.

July

- ACAN's 2020 Vision published "Building Back Better: What we should keep from the lockdown experience" a major report following public consultation in May and an online participative event in June.
- Permaculture Group formed to promote regenerative agriculture.
- **Tempestries** wall-hangings, colour-coded to illustrate the rise in local temperature between 1960 and 2017, hand-knitted and displayed at the Community Centre.

August

- Support extended to young people taking part in **National Citizen Service -** who raised money for ACAN.
- Local Food Directory published by Alton Local Food Initiative (ALFI)
 - As a booklet and on the ACAN and ALFI websites.

September

- Action on Plastics launched:
 - **Plastic patrols** initiated collecting waste in the local countryside.
 - Green Directory started listing local recycling points plus sources of eco-products and refills.

- Energy Alton launched two new initiatives
 - Clean Heat Alton Project [CHAP] to provide guidance on alternatives to gas and oil, with funding from Alton Town Council and Community Energy South.
 - New **Community Renewables Group** formed to promote solar power
- After a request by **Cycle Alton**, Alton Town Council provided new cycle stands and cycle repair pods.

October

- Detailed comment submitted by **Energy Alton** on the **Incinerator proposal** for the redundant Veolia site (near Froyle).
- All Saints Flower Bed planted to mark the Gilbert White 300th anniversary a partnership project between the *Gilbert White Museum*, the *Parish of the Resurrection/Eco-Church*, and *AVLAN/ACAN*.

November

- First ACAN Schools Newsletter sent out to 17 schools.
- Alton Community Hub **film screenings** launched online with "2040" will continue in 2021.
- Submission to HCC by **AVLAN** on verge-cutting policy aiming to prevent loss of wildflowers next year.

December

• Yuletide Fair - promotional stall to be mounted, restrictions permitting. *Tempestries* (see July, above) to be a feature of the display.

All year

- Links further developed with:
 - MP Damian Hinds including dialogue on a green economic recovery
 - Alton Town Council membership of the Climate Strategy Group
 - East Hants District Council support and impetus towards the development of their Climate Strategy
 - **Hampshire County Council** an ACAN Trustee addressed the August Council meeting which approved their **Climate Strategy**
 - Other groups in Hampshire, including PeCAN (Petersfield)
- Active membership of Hampshire Climate Action Network
- Alton Repair Cafe continued successfully in reduced form during Covid-19 restrictions under awning in Alton Public Gardens, then in Alton Community Centre main hall.
- Alton Community Cupboard continued 5 days/week delivering food to 80-100 families during lockdown, then by collection at the Community Centre
- Schools Eco-Hero competition held for children aged 4 11 to design an *Eco-Hero*, a person who does simple acts to help our planet

- Gumbi Education Fund adopted as ACAN's charity.
 - Fundraising to send young people for training in permaculture (sustainable/climatically-resilient agriculture) from the impoverished villages of Gumbi, Malawi.
 - **Open Zoom meeting**, featuring Luwayo Biswick, live from *The Permaculture Paradise Institute*, Malawi.
 - **Film A Vision of Paradise** made and published on YouTube: <u>https://youtu.be/WXLYMq6aThk</u>
- Local Media profile: Frequent coverage of our work achieved in *Round and About*, *The Alton Herald* and through *Wey Valley Radio* interviews.
- The River Wey in Alton
 - **Riversearch Riverfly** water quality monitoring group established pre-lockdown.
 - "Protecting the River Wey in Alton" launched with the Town Council, following online public meeting in November addressed by Glen Skelton, Wetland Landscapes Officer at Surrey Wildlife Trust.

- Encouraging local schools to go for Plastic free status, starting at the Butts.
- Green Open Homes event (virtual) to be organised by Energy Alton.
