It's their Future!

At a public online meeting on 10th October [see events section]

ACAN will share the shocking findings of a survey, commissioned from researcher Fiona Witcomb by youth eco-group Young ACAN, funded by the Community Lottery, to help us understand children's and young people's concerns about the climate crisis, and discuss ideas on what we can all do to help.



The major finding from the 335 responses (supported by qualitative discussion groups in 5 schools) is that climate anxiety is widespread amongst children and young people in and around Alton. Half the respondents report negative emotions towards their future because of the climate crisis - sadness, fear and powerlessness. One participant said

"You can easily fall into a dark hole in which you feel there's nothing you can do."

They feel they are being failed by adults at all levels of authority, who are simply not doing enough to address their concerns. Over 80% of respondents felt that they "were being failed as young people" by the Government in the fight against climate change. But 69% said that they felt the local community and council of Alton, "Cared about climate change in the same way I do". Respondents' focus was on action: 91% wanted to see more action on climate change locally, including more opportunities to take action themselves.





HCC asking us all to choose spots for trees


