

5 years of Fillup

The Fillup shop (15 High Street, next door to Home Hardware and opposite Goldfinch

books) has now been going for five years! Here Louise Bagnall, Fillup owner-manager,

explains the journey that she has been on during that time - and aks whether you could be

part of Fillup's future.

'Fillup first opened its doors in November 2020. Having grown more and more frustrated

seeing just how much non-recyclable plastic was clogging up my own household bin, I

wanted our community to have a resource where shopping without the need for single

use packaging was possible and where eco-friendly and ethical products could be

reliably found.

'Over the past 5 years, from our cleaning product range alone, *Fillup* has

prevented the need for an estimated 44,635\* pieces (1562kg\*\*) of single use packaging.

Packaging that would more than likely end up as landfill or in our oceans.

'Life on the high street is not without its challenges. Rising costs and competing with the

buying power of supermarkets, amongst other things, contribute to an on-going battle to

keep Fillup running as a financially viable business. To help us achieve this, we are

asking if there are members of our community that could help us! We are determined to

stick around and continue providing a much-needed resource for our town. Do you have

just a few hours spare each week to volunteer? If you do, and you would like to help us

on our continued mission, then please get in touch with me.'
