IPCC publishes its 6th Assessment Report (AR6)

A timely reminder of why we in ACAN do what we do.



In the past months we've seen flash floods rock communities at home in the UK and cause devastating loss of life in Europe and China. Relentless heat has stopped play at the Olympics whilst wildfires rage in Turkey and Greece.

Now, we know for certain: extreme weather like this is being made worse and more frequent by man-made global heating, according to a landmark report published in August.

The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change - the United Nations group responsible for climate science has released a crucial report assessing our climate.

We already know that we need to keep the goal of limiting the warming of the Earth to 1.5°C alive by urgently reducing emissions. But now, scientists are raising the alarm that time is running out to do it.

The window of opportunity to protect the things we love is closing - but the good news is that it hasn't slammed shut yet. If we can make sure as many people as possible know about this shocking report, support for bold climate action will grow and grow.

In order to prevent that door from slamming shut, we need real action and ambitious commitments from the countries that produce the most greenhouse gases. Those governments - including the UK's - need a plan to change their economies to be greener and healthier, and secure a safe future for us all.

The reality of climate change can be overwhelming, and it's easy to stick our heads in the sand and try to ignore it. But this problem won't go away without action from all of us, and every new person who joins our movement to protect the planet makes us stronger. If each of us shares a post on Twitter or Facebook today, together we'll be able to make hundreds of thousands of people more aware of what climate change really means. That's the first step to making sure politicians know they have to act.
