20s Plenty for Hampshire

Cycle Alton supports 20s Plenty for Hampshire, a new local branch of the national campaign group which pushes for a default speed limit of 20mph along roads where people live, play and work. 20s Plenty has amassed a huge amount of data showing, for instance, that driving at 20mph produces 25% fewer emissions than driving at 30mph. It makes sense to cut driving speeds for many reasons including road safety, air quality, noise levels and deterring rat-running. Scotland and Wales have already committed to reducing speeds in residential roads to 20mph; 20s Plenty is campaigning for the whole of England to follow suit.



ATC will discuss this at their Planning & Transport Committee meeting next Wednesday 1st December, with the recommendation that they agree to making 20mph the default speed limit in residential areas in Alton where people live, work, shop, and play or learn; also to agree to calling on Hampshire County Council (HCC) to implement this within 2 years. HCC has already agreed to review its policy on speed limits next year. If you'd like to get involved 20s Plenty for Hampshire would love to hear from you.

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Bentley Rail Crossing Public Meeting



A public meeting was held on 23rd November at Bentley Memorial Hall in which Network Rail representatives presented their case for installing a footbridge and two lifts at Bentley Station. Heavily used by pedestrians and cyclists, the closure of the level crossing would present a significant barrier to those with a bicycle. Other options such as an underpass, ramp or locking gates all have major drawbacks around safety, cost or feasibility, while the proposal has a strong safety case. The representatives answered many audience questions, with one remaining option - that of stopping every train at Bentley Station - seeming to have the

most potential to avoid the unpopular closure of the level crossing.

The footbridge and lift construction isn't a foregone conclusion as a public inquiry will need to be held because of local sentiment, and the issue will most likely be decided ultimately by the Secretary of State in a couple of years' time.

The working group opposing the plans now has a website: https://bentleycrossings.net/ and a formal letter of objection has been sent to Network Rail, signed by Cycle Alton amongst other signatories.
