#### **New Highway Code**

You're most probably aware that a revision to the Highway Code is to be published today, 29th January. In the absence of a timely government information campaign, the press has filled the void with inflammatory articles highlighting the supposed dangers the new rules will cause. In fact the new rules are simply clarifying existing guidance. Read about it here:

The government plans to communicate the new guidance in two phases:

- In early February the government's THINK! Campaign will launch a communications drive, backed by over £500,000 in funding, raising awareness of the changes and ensuring road users understand their responsibilities;
- A broader behaviour change campaign later in the year, to align with seasonal increases in active travel, to help embed the changes and encourage understanding and uptake of the new guidance.

#### **Active Travel England**

We'll be looking out for thesel



The government has just launched its long-awaited *Active Travel England* (ATE), the new cycling and walking inspectorate and funding body, with Chris Boardman as its interim commissioner.

ATE's responsibilities will be:

- driving up the standards of cycling and walking infrastructure; managing the national active travel budget;
- awarding funding for projects that meet the new national standards;
- inspecting & approving finished schemes;
- reporting on highway authorities for their performance on active travel;
- helping local authorities to train staff to spread good practice in

design, implementation and public engagement;

 acting as a statutory consultee on major planning applications to ensure that the largest new developments properly cater for pedestrians and cyclists.

ATE's establishment follows the government's commitment of £2 billion for cycling and walking over this Parliament. Its commitment to spending £27.4bn on new roads remains, however.

## **Anstey Park**

Cycle Alton has written to the Town Clerk and Cllr Suzie Burns, Chair of the Open Spaces Committee, to request they reconsider replacing a barrier in Anstey Park to prevent through-traffic. You may have noticed the planters that were installed there at a cost of £1000 were quickly moved aside then removed completely, after notification from sports clubs that an ambulance was delayed.

If emergency vehicles are told about the barrier then they can access the park via the Anstey Road entrance without any delay.

We believe allowing through-traffic in the park turns this from a space for people into yet another space dominated by cars. It would make the park safer, quieter, less polluted and a more pleasant experience for those visiting it. It would also contribute towards achieving some of the actions listed in the ATC Climate Change Action Plan 2020-2023.

She said "We keep finding abandoned bikes that nobody claims. Nobody wants to take them either. There is one in my ward right now. We were wondering if anyone might want to collect them and do them up and give to free for people who can't afford them?"

While hesitant at the idea of collecting up bikes which presumably belong to somebody, it does seem a pity to let them remain abandoned and unused when somebody could be making use of them. It would need somebody with the time, space, effort and skills to do them up and then to organise their donation.
