For those who are hesitant about cycling in our local Alton traffic, Cycle Alton is running a series of led bicycle rides in March which aim to increase confidence and deliver skills to would-be cyclists to cope safely with the traffic.

Topics to be covered include local safe routes, appropriate clothing, road positioning, hazards to watch out for and negotiating junctions and roundabouts.

To be held on Saturday mornings, the rides will be about five miles long, and each will begin and return to either Chawton or Holybourne.

This is open to anyone who needs a confidence boost, and will be led and accompanied by experienced cyclists.

NCN route 224 in Jubilee Field

The lack of a suitably dropped kerb to circumvent the almost permanently locked gate at the Cricket Club end of Jubilee Fields was highlighted in the last newsletter. The back path is also part of National Cycle Network route 224 and has been resurfaced. It's now wider and smoother yet still somewhat bumpy for cyclists!

We're pleased to say the dropped kerb issue was rectified by the contractors and it's now much more user-friendly.

Nearby another matter which will be raised with Alton Town Council is the dropped kerb from the car park to the back path. Whenever the car park is open, invariably a vehicle is parked there, blocking the route. Some judiciously-placed hatching might keep it clear for bicycle riders!



E-Bike Hire

Alton Town Council has two electric bikes available for hire, a Carrera Crosscity folding bike and an Orbea Comfort 32. The Orbea has full-sized wheels, and would be perfect for anyone considering joining a local cycle ride but is concerned about the hills!
