A couple of us have now been invited for a 'relaxed exchange of information', hopefully in early August.

Alton Town Council has recently installed a number of new bike racks in public open spaces around the town. You can find them in Anstey Park, Butts Green, Flood Meadows, Holybourne Play Area, Jubilee Playing Fields and Kings Pond.

Hampshire County Council's new Local Transport Plan

Cycle Alton sent in a response to Hampshire County Council's Local Transport Plan (LTP4). HCC's aim was to identify whether any further changes are required before it is considered for adoption. We know many of you also responded, for which we thank you for taking the time. It was a somewhat daunting task, but this was a rare opportunity to let the decision-makers know what we think.

The new Transport Plan will replace the existing LTP3, and will provide a framework to guide all future transport planning and investment in order to deliver their desired outcomes by 2050.
