# Cycle Alton's Second Birthday

Cycle Alton celebrated its second birthday last week at Alton Maltings with our first ever in-person gathering.

Wine and cake was provided to thank everyone who has helped Cycle Alton to establish and grow into the near 200-strong group it is today.

A Powerpoint presentation by Chris showed what has been achieved so far, following which there was a lively discussion on what has been learnt. Everyone was then invited to consider where best to focus future efforts, and a wide range of suggestions was



put forward such as a mass bike ride though Alton, and led rides to school for children along the school routes we've identified.

There'll be other campaigning ideas happening over the next months and we'll send details when we have them. Please be prepared to get involved as much as you can!

### Hampshire County Council's new Local Transport Plan

Hampshire County Council has published a new Local Transport Plan (LTP4) which is now out for consultation. Please take a look and send in your response by the closing date of 26th June. LTP4 is a huge and ambitious plan for Hampshire which says many of the right things, but is it ambitious enough to get the government funding we will need, or to sufficiently cut climate emissions? ### Removal of barriers at Kings Pond

A couple of barriers which impeded cycle and wheelchair access between Waterside Court off Paper Mill Lane and Kings Pond have recently been removed.

As part of Hampshire county council's commitment to encouraging more active travel, a review was carried out on the use of staggered barriers on walking and cycling routes, as well as on cyclist dismount signs, end of route signs and cycle prohibition orders. These can restrict access for some types of cycles, including adapted cycles for people with disabilities. We don't know if this removal was as a result of the list of barriers sent by us to HCC, but it's welcome all the same!
