


Cycle Alton Newsletter Spring 2025

East Hampshire LCWIP finally approved by Hampshire

On his recent Decision Day, the Executive Member for Hampshire 2050 & Corporate Services, Cllr Nick Adams-King, <u>approved</u> the East Hampshire Local Cycling & Walking Plan (LCWIP).

Once published, the LCWIP will support funding bids for active travel infrastructure and will form part of HCC's suite of documents that form the local transport strategy for East Hampshire.

LCWIPs are important for the Hampshire County Council (HCC) <u>Local Transport Plan 4</u>'s vision of delivering a "carbon neutral, resilient and inclusive transport system designed around and with people".



HCC has launched a public consultation on where to make savings to try to reduce a budget shortfall of £97.6 million for 2025/26.

One of the areas being considered, of particular interest to cyclists, are on PLANNED highway maintenance.

This proposes to remove HCC funding which supplements Department for Transport (DfT) funding allocated for planned highway maintenance, such as large-scale structural repairs, surface treatments and drainage improvements. It does NOT include funding for reactive road maintenance e.g. pot hole repairs, which will remain unaffected.
