THE HAMPSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL ELECTION AND THE CLIMATE CRISIS

Election

On Thursday 6 May voters in Alton Town and Alton Rural will go to the polls to elect our new representatives on Hampshire County Council. We in ACAN see this as a perfect opportunity to step up our demands for action on climate.

ACAN's role

In the absence of any formal hustings, ACAN is writing to each local candidate asking for their views and plans for action to tackle the climate emergency.

The next four years will be crucial in terms of decisions and actions taken to reduce and adapt to climate change. Our representatives must be willing and able to lead the way and work constructively with MPs and councillors, regardless of party affiliation and across all districts, towns and parishes. That is why ACAN is aiming to provide information to help us vote according to candidates' policies.

ACAN's questions to candidates

- 1. Describe any actions you have taken in the last 5 years that demonstrate leadership on climate change issues.
- 2. If elected, what actions will you take to ensure HCC commits to managing its pension investments to align with the Paris target to limit temperature rise to 1.5°C?
- 3. If elected, what specifically will you do to help decarbonise transport including aviation, rail and road?
- 4. If elected, what actions will you take to make it easier for businesses and individuals to decrease carbon emissions?
