Highlights of 2024-2025



Thanks to funding from the Transition Network, this year's Young ACAN Schools' Partnership project was named 'Treasure Not Trash', with the aim of educating our young people about waste. The biggest event was our 3rd Eco Conference which was held at Alton College in January and attended by 12 local schools. Through an afternoon of talks and workshops, the event aimed to educate the children about waste. Pupils were also set a challenge to return to school and to teach their peers about the issues of waste and how to reduce it by leading a whole school assembly.

As well as the conference, this year schools have also had the opportunity to participate in a range of opportunities, planned by the schools' partnership during their meetings. These included: a Christmas 'Reuse, Regift, Relove' stall, Waste Beast Animation Competition, Secondary art workshops at Alton College, Repair Cafe film in collaboration with Alton College Film Students and a Pollinator Poster competition.



One of our most exciting projects this year is our Waste Beast Animation. Launched at the Eco Conference in January, students of all ages were given the opportunity to create a storyboard for a children's animation to educate them about the problems of waste and how to tackle them. Working with local animator, Flossy Waters, who also designed our logo, Emma and Scott, have ensured that the children's ideas and words are reflected in the final animation - it truly collaborative project, written by children for children. Last week, some of the winners of the competition worked together at the Butts Primary School to record the dialogue and rap for the upcoming animation (see photo above) which will be released in September.

Climate Action Plans - Lets' Go Zero

As part of the DfE Sustainability and Climate Change Strategy, all schools will be required to have a sustainability lead and climate action plan. Although this is non-statutory, Young ACAN believes that this is a really positive step forward, in ensuring that schools are responding to the climate and nature crisis. This year, Young ACAN has hosted a series of CPD sessions for its partners to get ready for this. In February and April, it was great to welcome Libby Terraz from Let's Go Zero to our partnership who led two sessions to support schools with their Climate Action Plans (CAP). Libby helped us make sense of the CAP and supported us with lots of useful ideas and resources to realise our actions within our settings.
